



St. Ives is an excellent centre from which to tour beautiful western Cornwall. Within easy reach of *Edgar's* are many of Cornwall's most picturesque places including St. Michael's Mount, Truro's cathedral city, Mousehole, the Minack open-air theatre, Land's End and many other places of outstanding natural beauty. The Eden Project and National Maritime Museum Cornwall are also within easy reach.

St. Ives town was granted its Charter in 1639 and Mayor Choosing still takes place each year. St. Ives Bay is officially one of the "Most Beautiful Bays in the World" - our five golden sandy beaches have attracted holidaymakers ever since the Great Western Railway began running its steam trains along the prettiest branch line in the west. Around the Bay, between St. Ives and Godrevy Lighthouse you can also take your pick of Carbis Bay, Lelant (Porthkidney Sands) or Hayle's three *miles* of golden sands.

In the last century artists, too, discovered the town. Its clear natural light continues to inspire the many resident painters in their studios & galleries.



Many of these are open to visitors, as are the Tate Gallery at Porthmeor, the Barbara Hepworth Museum on Barnoon Hill and the Leach Pottery just across the road from *Edgar's*.



Edgar's guest accommodation comprises of double, twin and family rooms located on the ground floor and first floor. All have en suite showers, shower and soap dispensers, toiletries, towels, hairdryers, TV's, hospitality trays with coffee and tea making facilities, individually controlled central heating and radio alarms. All designed for you to relax and enjoy your holiday. Choose from a selection of guest rooms named after local places such as Porthminster, Godrevy, Mousehole (pronounced "Mowzel"), Tregenna, Tremedda and Zennor.



Our delicious traditional Cornish breakfast consists of your choice from locally sourced prime cured bacon, special recipe sausages made for us by our local butcher, free range eggs, fresh tomatoes and mushrooms all prepared and cooked to order to individual taste and accompanied by a selection of teas and coffees. There's always a range of fresh fruit and cereals, locally produced fish cakes from Matthew Stevens' fish cellar "Down'long", fresh bread either from local craft bakers or from our own kitchen and home made preserves.

We recommend you explore St. Ives' great variety of restaurants for your evening meal: we can make suggestions or assist with reservations if you wish. Afterwards, relax in one of our comfortable lounges (one has a real fire in cooler weather) on your return to *Edgar's*.



Bus services (including the open-top summer service to Zennor and Land's End) stop opposite or near the hotel, the South West Coastal Path is nearby and you can walk down to the beach or picturesque harbour wharf in just 20 minutes or so.

The South West Coast Path lies just across the fields from Chy an Creet and has spectacular views at every turn. Walk to Zennor for lunch at the "Tinnars" or circumnavigate the Penwith peninsula, returning to Chy an Creet at the end of each day's walk by the open-top bus or by taxi cab. We offer drying facilities and secure cycle storage for our more adventurous guests.

There is free on-site parking for the duration of your visit (very rare in St Ives) and each guest room offers superb *en suite* facilities presented and maintained to a very high standard. Three of our guest rooms are conveniently situated on the ground floor.

Relaxing lounges accommodate those restful evenings and unobtrusive hospitality is on hand throughout your stay from hoteliers David and Judith. Neighbouring the hotel is the world famous Leach Pottery, established in 1920 with Edgar's assistance and now an important heritage site. Within 20 minutes walk there are the golden sand beaches of Porthminster, Porthmeor, Porthwidden, and St Ives Harbour; just 5 minutes' walk away is St Ives Leisure Centre, while at the same time we are ideally located for all major attractions in Cornwall.

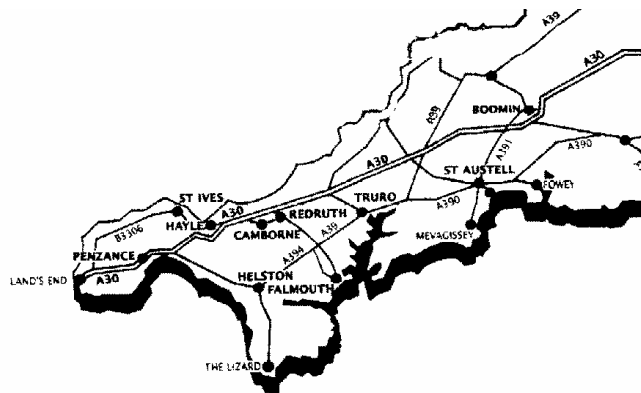

ARRIVING at Edgar's:

...by CAR:

- ❑ Follow the A30 west through Cornwall to the Lelant roundabout, just west of Hayle;
 - ❑ Take the right-hand lane and second exit for St. Ives and Tate Gallery
 - ❑ Drive straight ahead at the first mini-roundabout, **but**
 - ❑ At the second **mini-roundabout** do **not** enter Lelant but turn **left** on to the "**(B3311) Holiday Route for day visitors**" to St. Ives and follow this road for about 5 km:
 - ❑ Drive past Trink and Balnoon,
 - ❑ At the wide B3311 T-junction turn right towards St. Ives and **drive through Halsetown**,
 - ❑ At the next T-junction, turn right again, (*you are now joining the B3306 coastal road from Lands End, Sennen & Zennor as it enters St. Ives*)
 - ❑ Look for the Fire Station (**Slow down**) and the Leach Pottery's white sign (both on the right).
 - ❑ We are directly opposite the Leach Pottery – drive in, unload your cases and pick up your keys!

...By TRAIN or COACH:

- ❑ St Ives has its own railway branch line; change at St Erth on the Paddington to Penzance main line.
- ❑ National Express coaches also serve St Ives.
